

# Winder Slide

## not-so-easy

Unlike a lot of other tunes in this book, the difference between the “easy” and “not-so-easy” versions is very small. Here we’ve just applied a few simple chords and sped it up to about 85BPM. It’s a beautiful tune, so take your time and have fun with it. Remember, bar 10 is only two beats long.

Fifth line of guitar tablature. The notes are: D1 (1), D0 (0), D2 (2), D0 (0), D9 (9), D8 (8), and D7 (7).
